## **DECISION OF THE TAUPO DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE**

### **The Application**

This is an application by **The Rogue Bore Limited** for an On-Site Special Licence pursuant to Section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 for the **Summer Season**. It was formally received by the Taupō District Licensing Committee on 23rd January 2020.

### **Reasons for the Decision**

As we said last time, this was not a standard application for an alcohol licence. The applicant sought to introduce their boutique range of geothermally produced beers in an outdoor venue over the summer months of December through to early February. An extension of lease has been negotiated for the period 11 February to 26 April.

The carpark at 29 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo has been transformed into an outside bar with picnic tables serviced by a container bar, ablution block and food trucks.

It must be securely fenced as the surrounding area is an Alcohol Ban area and no alcohol can be permitted to be taken from the site. Equally noise must be carefully controlled so as not to cause a nuisance especially from 10.00pm.

We put the applicant on notice that they will be closely monitored by the agencies and an exemplary level of performance will be expected of them. No further extensions will be considered.

The reports of the Police and the Medical Officer of Health do not oppose this application.

### **The Decision**

I am satisfied that the criteria of Section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 have been satisfactorily addressed by the applicant and the licence may issue subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold and supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday from 11.00am to 12.30am the following day.**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.


3. The entire premises is designated as a Supervised area.
4. COA qualified door staff are to be engaged from 10.00pm onwards.
5. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
6. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
8. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
9. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
10. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
  - a. At every point of sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons,
  - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises,
  - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty,
  - d. The licensee must provide information and advice about forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.

**Duration:**

**This licence is only in force from 11 February 2020 to 26 April 2020.**

The licensed premises known as The Rogue Bore Container Bar situated at 29 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo, is more precisely identified as outlined in the event site plan provided with the application, as received by the Taupo District Licensing Committee on 23 January 2020.

## **Taupo District Licensing Committee Special Licence – On Site**

*Section 22 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*

**Pursuant** to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **The Rogue Bore Limited** is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at 29 Tuwharetoa Street, Taupo, and known as The Rogue Bore Container Bar for consumption on the premises, to any person attending the following occasion or event (or series of occasions or events): **Summer Season Extension.**

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a managers or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.

### **Conditions:**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold and supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday from 11.00am to 12.30am the following day.**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.
3. The entire premises is designated as a Supervised area.
4. COA qualified door staff are to be engaged from 10.00pm onwards.
5. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
6. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
7. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
8. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
9. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
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  - a. At every point of sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons,
  - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises,
  - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty,
