DECISION OF THE TAUPO DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE

The Application

This is an application by **Taupo Racing Club Incorporated** for an On-Site Special Licence pursuant to Section 138 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 for the **Taupo Pak n Save Summer Festival**. It was formally received by the Taupō District Licensing Committee on 6th November 2020.

Reasons for the Decision

The applicant is a responsible entity to hold a Special Licence and certificated managers will oversee the sale supply and consumption of alcohol. Additional discretionary conditions have been negotiated with the applicant and will be applied.

The reports of the Police and the Medical Officer of Health do not oppose this application.

The Decision

I am satisfied that the criteria of Section 142 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 have been satisfactorily addressed by the applicant and the licence may issue subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Alcohol may be sold and supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: Wednesday 30 December 2020 from 10.00am to 6.00pm.
- 2. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
- 3. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed.
- 4. All marquee bars are to be designated as Supervised areas.
- 5. No BYO ("Bring Your Own") alcohol is permitted in the licensed area as per the site plan, dated as received by the Taupo District Licensing Committee on 6 November 2020.
- 6. A certificated duty manager shall be dedicated to the "Nation Truck Bar".
- 7. All alcohol vessels are to be depressurised upon purchase
- 8. Wine shall not be sold in bottles, rather four plastic cups of wine.
- 9. Sufficient security shall be in place to ensure vehicles, chilly bins and the like are searched to prevent alcohol from been smuggled in to the event.

- 10. Alcohol serves will be reduced to two per person from 4.00pm or earlier if deemed necessary by Police/ Council/ Health representatives.
- 11. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
- 12. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
- 13. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point-of-sale detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons,
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty,
 - d. The licensee must provide information and advice about forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.

The licensed premises known as the Taupo Racing Club situated at 471 Centennial Drive, Taupo, is more precisely identified as outlined in the event site plan provided with the application, as received by the Taupo District Licensing Committee on 6 November 2020.
