

Around town

2018 has been a busy year in the Mangakino area, with several projects underway around the town. There has been an ongoing programme of upgrading the Mangakino sewer system, which began in 2017 with cleaning and assessment by closed-circuit cameras of the entire network. This process showed us that 60 percent of the 19.4kms of pipes needed to be relined, and in 2018 we completed half of that relining process at a cost of \$1.5 million. The remainder will be completed in 2019 and will ensure the system is in good shape, with less likelihood of leaks and many years of service ahead of it.

Many residents will have seen that there has been a lot going on in Kahu Street recently. The roadway is being improved, with new curbing, footpaths, a cul-de-sac, and a new stormwater line which will mean a more resilient supply and less pooling of water during heavy rain storms. A new water main has been installed, and all Kahu Street works will be finished by the end of January.

There has also been a lot going in Whakamaru, with a significant upgrade of the waste water treatment plant there which has allowed us to improve the quality of discharged effluent and reduce contaminant loading to Lake Whakamaru. The treatment plant is very close to the water edge, so this is an important step in ensuring we don't create adverse environmental effects (such as weed and algae growth) along the shore line.

And last but by no means least, Mangakino residents will soon be noticing a difference in their street lighting. We are joining in a nationwide programme to upgrade street lights to new LED technology that lasts three times longer than traditional lighting and is 57 per cent more power efficient. This work will get underway in the New Year and should be completed in April 2019.

Freedom camping ambassadors for Taupō District

Four part-time freedom camping ambassadors will be out and about this summer to assist and advise freedom campers across the district, and particularly in high profile areas like Hipapatua Reserve (Reids Farm). The ambassadors will be advising campers on how long they can stay, what to do with refuse, local alcohol bylaws, and how to take care of our environment by not washing in our lakes and rivers and using designated toilet facilities.

The ambassadors will also be collecting data about freedom camping so that we can get a better understanding of visitor trends, how long campers are staying, what they do while here, and what facilities they use. The ambassadors aim to be a friendly face for visitors and locals alike, but they will also be passing on information about any unwanted behaviour to our compliance teams.

This initiative has been made possible through a funding agreement between Taupō District Council and the Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment. It is part of the Tourism Facilities Development Grant Fund and covers the 2018-2019 season.

Mangakino **Community Pool**

Entry tickets cannot be purchased at the pool. Tickets can be bought from the Mangakino Service Centre and Tom and Shorty Cafe. Tickets must be presented when entering the pools.

Free entry for local children under five years of age Children (0-13): $$1 = 1 \times \text{ orange ticket}$

Students (14+) & Seniors: $$2 = 2 \times \text{ orange tickets}$

Adults (18+): $$3 = 3 \times 0$ orange tickets

Children under eight years old must be accompanied by a person over the age of 16, who must wear swimwear at all times. The person must remain within arm's reach of the child while they are in the water.

The pool is open during the summer school holidays (weather permitting). During this period, the pool is open daily between 12.30pm and 4.30pm, except for Christmas Day when the pool is closed.
