

Part F: Action Programme

The following list of activities must be undertaken in order to fulfil the goals and objectives of this Management Plan.

Please note: These activities are not necessarily in order of priority.

- · To upgrade the play equipment in the children's' playground
- To publish an information brochure
- To increase the native vegetation of the reserves
- · To continue the phasing out of pines
- To develop and maintain walkways along the Riverbank Recreational and Scenic Reserve and Spa Thermal Park
- To identify and where appropriate, interpret the geothermal features of the reserves
- To investigate the natural history of the reserves and where appropriate to interpret
 this knowledge to the public
- · To investigate and interpret, where appropriate, the history of the reserves

- To investigate the consideration of use and management of the abseiling site.
- To investigate the improvement of access for people with disabilities to the toilets on Spa Thermal Park
- To consider renaming County Avenue so that the name is more in keeping with the recreational theme of the area Spa Thermal Park e.g.: Spa Park Avenue, AC Baths Avenue and Delany Drive
- To undertake a natural heritage study (wildlife and plants) of the Spa Thermal Park
 Riverbank Recreational and Scenic Reserve to assess the need to protect natural habitats
- To undertake a Significant Natural Values Study of the Spa Thermal Park Riverbank Recreational and Scenic Reserve
- To ensure that the reserve land is protected for the purpose of providing areas for recreation activities with emphasis on the retention of open spaces and on outdoor recreational activities, including recreational tracks along the riverbank.
- To undertake an environmental impact assessment on the effect of widening Spa Road (in relation to proposed road network changes) on the reserve site for the Adventure Tourism Area
- To ensure that the lease (pursuant to Sections 54 and 56 of the Reserves Act 1977)
 within the Adventure Tourism Area is varied to permit additional activities and
 require payment of rental for the additional activities as and when additional
 activities receives/obtains approvals
- To ensure that any lessee for the Adventure Tourism Area will provide annual reports prepared by a qualified consulting engineer to Council on:
 - 1) the stability of the cliffs
 - 2) the platform(s) foundation
 - 3) the integrity of their structures, their support and their continued ability to function as designed.
