Think smart – it's hot out there

It's been hot and dry out there and this means we need to limit the amount of water we're using and refrain from lighting fires.

Long periods without rain have meant people have been using more water, particularly for irrigating lawns and gardens. This is putting additional load on water treatment plants.

Up to the close of Wednesday, we had already used 411,000 cubic metres of water this month.

In September, the Lake Terrace water treatment plant processed just over 180,000 cubic metres of water. By last month that had increased to over 427,000 cubic metres.

Irrigation systems and sprinklers can now only be used between 6am and 8am and 6pm and 8pm. This is the best way to hydrate your lawn or garden because it minimises water evaporation from the sun and potential leaf burn.

Residents whose properties end in 1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 can use sprinklers on odd numbered calendar days, while those whose addresses end in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8 can use theirs on even numbered calendar days.

We need to use water wisely so no further restrictions are needed. The forecast for the coming days is for more hot, dry weather so it's important we take action now!



The conditions have also prompted a total fire ban across rural areas of the Taupō District.


The risk of fire is now extreme and we need people to remain vigilant in case of fire.

Anyone who sees any suspicious smoke should phone 111 immediately.

The ban means permits for open fires in rural areas will not be issued under any circumstance until the ban ends. Take care out there!

Waitanyi Day festival is coming!

Free buses are running to bring people to the festival from Mangakino and Turangi but spots are limited so register with your local service centre to come along.

Last year over 4500 people came along to Waitangi Taupō Moana and it would be great to see even more this year!

Taupō Summer Concert

The 2015 Taupō Summer Concert is nearly here and it's expected to be another huge event for the Taupō District this year.

Legendary artists Heart, Foreigner and Three Dog Night are all playing at the Taupō amphitheatre this Saturday, 24 January.

The concert is an annual event that has attracted up to 14,000 people in the past. At the time of going to print, promoter Greenstone Entertainment expected the concert would sell out with 14,500 tickets sold.

It's a big, iconic event for Taupō and one many look forward to on our events calendar, so make sure you get along and enjoy some classic rock.
