Reserve management plan for south western bay settlements

The first ever reserve management plan for the south western bay settlements has been adopted by council and covers the reserves of Pukawa, Omori, Kuratau and Whareroa.

The South Western Bay Settlements Reserve Management Plan was adopted at the council's June meeting.

We held several meetings with the community and over 80 submissions were made when the plan went out for consultation over the summer period, which led to some key changes being made.

In the draft, there was an allowance for freedom camping for one annual rally at Omori, but a large number of submissions were against this so the plan was changed to ban freedom camping altogether.

The draft plan also suggested a process begin that would see Pukawa Esplanade Reserve be handed back to original owners Ngati Manunui. However after hearing feedback from the community, we decided we would instead work with iwi and the community to improve relationships and the community's understanding of the cultural and historical significance of the reserve.

Kinloch reserve use under review

We are reviewing the use of several reserves in Kinloch. Before decisions are made the council would like your feedback.

KINLOCH BIKE KIOSK PROPOSAL

A mountain bike kiosk in Kinloch to provide for the increasing number of bikers using the area may become a reality after a proposal was put to the council last month.

The kiosk would act as a hub for mountain biking activities and provide bike hire, transfers, repairs and maintenance and sell parts. It would be located near the Bike Taupō shelter and help to promote the Great Lake Cycle Trails.

However, the creation of the kiosk would require an amendment to the Kinloch Reserve Management Plan. Currently commercial activity is not allowed on the Kinloch Domain Reserve, so this would need to be altered before the council could grant a licence for the kiosk to operate from the site. Should we amend the plan to allow the kiosk or keep the area free from commercial activity?
