was to complete the third year of the financial strategy so we were heading towards a balanced budget and no

longer 'putting part of our loan interest on the credit

card'. We came in just one percent short of balancing

the budget which was four percent higher than what

million was a fantastic achievement, especially given

Rockwall opening hours change

The Edge Rockwall at Taupō Events Centre is getting new hours to make it more accessible and increase its use.

The rockwall was earmarked for closure before consultation for the Long-term Plan earlier this year, but overwhelming support for its continuation prompted the Council to retain it.

The decision was met with plenty of celebration from our local rock climbing community and we are happy to keep it!

We have, however, recognised the need to change the hours to better suit those who use it. This will help us maximise patronage and minimise costs, so it's a win-win situation! See the new hours in the box to the side.

We are also extending the hours every school holidays to include the weekends, when our hours of operation will be 1pm-9pm on Mondays and Thursdays, and 10am-5pm on all other days.


The new hours start on Monday and are subject to change depending on whether the stadium is booked for an event. You can check the latest timetable at www.taupo.govt.nz/rockwall.

Restricted fire season kicks in

If you want to light an open fire in a rural area in the coming months, you now need to get a permit from

The restricted fire season started in the Taupō District yesterday and will continue until further notice.

Our rural fire team uses the permits to monitor rural fires, which include outdoor pizza ovens and braziers.

Fire permits must be applied for at least 48 hours prior to the fire. Application forms are available from council offices on Lake Terrace, in Turangi and Mangakino or by contacting the council on 07 376 0899.

All applicants must sign the permit before it is issued. Be safe out there this summer!

Charter Parade in Taupō next weekend

Cadets and officers from the New Zealand Army will march down the streets of central Taupō next weekend for the 17th annual Charter Parade. The parade is on at 11am on Saturday, October 10, and reaffirms the army's historical links with the district.
