## Strap yourself in: the cycle challenge is coming!

The Contact Lake Taupō Cycle Challenge is back for another year next weekend, and there will be bikes galore circumnavigating the lake for the 39th time!

This is New Zealand's biggest cycling event and we are privileged to host it in our district each year.

It brings together up to 8000 cyclists from over 20 countries competing in 18 different events, with both road cycling and mountain biking options available.

This year the main events are on Saturday, November 28 and the Criterium event is the day before. There will be some road

closures because of the event and huge number of participants and supporters, so make sure you're aware of this if you're driving around town.

Road closures include parts of several major roads in the town centre such as Tongariro Street, Tamamutu Street and Lake Terrace. Some roads will have restricted access at times including the roads around Tongariro Domain and part of Poihipi and Whangamata roads.

Stay safe out there, pedal hard and we'll see you on the other side!





## Rewarding hard work

he 2015 Taupō District Sports Awards were held at the Great Lake Centre last Friday evening, hosted by Sport Waikato and the Taupō Sports Advisory Council. The evening not only recognises outstanding achievements in competition but also acknowledges administrators, referees, umpires, coaches and supporters.



One very special award is the Outstanding Contribution to Sport. This award honours a person in the Taupō District who has dedicated their services over a long period of time. This year's recipient was long-serving rugby referee Dr Alistair Fraser. This indeed proved to be a very popular acknowledgement.

Master of ceremonies and guest speaker Phillip Tataurangi, professional golfer and past Taupō resident of 18 years, was excellent in providing an insight into his career and gave some great advice to up and coming athletes into what makes an elite sportsperson.

Taupō Sports Advisory Council (SAC) does great things in our community and we at the council have a great partnership with it. SAC distributes funds on behalf of our council to assist local sportspeople and as its chairman Mark O'Callaghan says, this is a vitally important aspect of local sport which demonstrates the importance our council places on sport as a contribution to community well-being.

Looking ahead to next week, we have the Contact Lake Taupō Cycle Challenge. Next year will be a notable milestone for this event, with the celebration of its 40th anniversary. The sole beneficiary of the proceeds is Taupō Moana Rotary who in turn distribute funds via grants to community groups. This is over and above monies distributed to volunteer groups involved with running the cycle challenge. This week Taupō Moana Rotary and Taupō Rotary merged to form Lake Taupō Rotary based at Rotary House and will continue to provide these grants as well as the community van.

One overarching theme, and certainly not exclusively to sport, is the engagement by volunteers and numerous community groups within the Taupō District which help to make these events as successful as they are. I thank them for their time and passion – it certainly helps make our district a great place to live.
