Our Waitangi Day festival is returning for 2016 tomorrow, and this year we'll have contemporary Māori artist Maisey Rika headlining the event!

The event is on at Tongariro Domain from noon to 5pm.

Rika is a singer and songwriter who performs in both English and Māori and she will be joined by musician Rob Ruha on stage. Unfortunately Turangi's rising star Jackson Owens has been called

back to the US and can no longer join us, but Aaron Moeke from Turangi, Daniel Trueman from Mangakino and Michaela Pointon and Tegan McConachie from Taupō will all be there.

There will also be kapa haka and other cultural groups performing.

The day will also feature children's inflatables, food stalls, competitions, prizes, art and craft exhibitions, and a dedicated wood skills and processing arena.

In previous years we have had over 4500 people attending, including groups from Turangi and Mangakino.

We are working alongside sponsors Ministry of Culture and Heritage, BayTrust, First Sovereign Trust, Tüwharetoa Māori Trust Board, Lake Rotoaira Forest Trust, Lake Taupō Forest Trust, Ngāti Tüwharetoa Fisheries Charitable Trust, Mighty River Power, Contact Energy, Taupō District Creative Communities Scheme and Creative Taupō to ensure the festival is free to attend.

KEEPING THE KIDS READING

Ask Oran Hammersley why she took part in the Taupō District Libraries summer reading programme, and she'll give you plenty of reasons.

"I thought it would be a big chance to get my reading skills up," she says. "It's really cool. I think it really helped me with meeting people I didn't know."

The eight-year-old from Taupō was one of over 135 kids aged five to 13 to take part in the reading programme these holidays.

The programme involved children reading books and reporting back to library staff.

Although she only had to report on four books, Oran can't recall

the amount she read. "I just kept reading all the time," she says. Her mother, Sarah Hammersley, said it was the first time Oran

had done the programme and it had exceeded expectations.

The programme ran from mid-December to late January. It ended with finale parties at Tongariro Domain in Taupō and the Vertical Assault indoor climbing wall in Turangi where children received a free book.
