MANGAKINO TOWN CENTRE UPGRADE PROGRESSES

Have you been wondering what all the activity is going on in Mangakino's town centre?

Our contractors are hard at work on the redevelopment of the town centre and progress is going well!

Work started late last month after a blessing at the site. It is the second stage of the redevelopment – the first of which was the building of the popular new skate park in town.

This second stage focuses on the creation of a new playground, seating and shaded areas. Contractors have started on the new decking and the installation of playground equipment and foundations.

It has been designed in consultation with the community and is expected to be completed by the end of April.
