IT'S ANNUAL PLAN TIME!

It's hard to believe it has already been a year since we asked for feedback on our Long-term Plan for 2015-2025! Over the past 12 months we have been busy implementing the first year of that plan, now it's time to look to what we said we would do in year two – 2016/17.

Due to a law change, we now only need to consult on any significant changes we are proposing from what we indicated in the Long-term Plan for the year.

The good news is we are only proposing to make a major change to one of our projects, extending the Taupō water supply to Waitahanui. We were successful in applying for a \$1.942 million Ministry of Health subsidy to extend the water supply to all properties at

Waitahanui but feedback from residents was that the cost was too high when spread across a small number of properties, and some residents wanted to retain bore water.

Since then, we have been investigating ways to fund the \$1.033 million shortfall for the project to proceed and secure a quality water supply for generations to come.

It was my pleasure to meet with the Governor-General of New Zealand, Sir Jerry Mateparae, this week when he was in the Taupō District to get a taste of our local industry, tourism and hospitality.

His Excellency and his wife, Lady Janine Mateparae, were in Taupō and Turangi as part of their farewell tour, so

to speak. I had a conversation with Sir Jerry when I met him in Wellington last year and he mentioned he'd like to get up to Taupō so it was fantastic he was finally able to experience our beautiful district in an official capacity.

As part of the trip, Their Excellencies visited Hirangi Marae, where they were joined by myself and paramount chief Sir Tumu te Heuheu, and took a trip out on the lake to Mine Bay to see the Māori rock carvings during their stay. What a great way to experience our culture and our famous Taupō District hospitality!

Sir Jerry actually has some close ties with our district – he's a descendent of our own Ngāti Tūwharetoa and, no doubt for him, it was something of a homecoming. He told me his mother is from Waitahanui and his father is from Tokaanu, so he's very comfortable here in the district. He's got very fond memories of Taupō and I can see why - he fits right in here - he's a very down-to-earth, nice guy with no airs and graces.

There was also a sad note to the week with the passing of esteemed Taupō playwright, poet and author Rowley Habib. The Governor-General actually mentioned he had read a lot of Mr Habib's work, which shows how far and wide it was appreciated. Mr Habib made a huge impact on the literary and performance arts world and his contribution to Māori arts was recognised by many over the years. He was born in Oruanui in 1933 and died on Sunday, marking the end of a remarkable life. I express my heartfelt condolences to his friends and whanau - it is a great loss for our district and New Zealand
