DOGS ONLINE MAKES REGISTRATION EASY I

If you would rather spend time with your dog than fill out forms about them – we have the solution for you!

You can register, pay and manage your dog registration online through our website.

All you have to do is visit www.taupo.govt.nz and set up your account. With this, you can register online when the time comes, because we will already have all your details. Simple!

To set up your account, you just need your customer number and dog owner number. If you don't have them, give our Customer Service team a call and we can give them to you.

> We introduced these changes last year and already hundreds of people have signed up to make registering their dog easier.

All dogs need to be registered by July 1. Dogs that are not registered may earn their owner an infringement fee of \$300, so it's a good idea to get organised now. Then when you receive your applications you'll be ready to go!

If you are having trouble paying the registration fee, give us a call and we may be able to help with a payment plan.
