# **NOMINATIONS OPEN NEXT WEEK FOR ELECTIONS**

YOUR VOTE YOUR COMMUNITY

Have you got what it takes to help look after the place we love? Budding local government candidates who believe they do can put their hand up to run in the 2016 local elections when nominations open next Friday, July 15.

Elected roles up for grabs in October's election include the district's mayor and councillors, regional councillors, community board members and members of district health Boards.

There are only a couple of requirements candidates need to meet to be eligible to stand for election - to be enrolled as a parliamentary elector anywhere in New Zealand and be a New Zealand citizen. Once eligible, candidates need to be nominated by two electors whose names appear on the electoral roll for the Taupō District. They'll need to do this before nominations close at noon on Friday August 12.

Democracy and community engagement manager Tina Jakes said local elections give people a chance to play an significant role in the future of our district. "Successful candidates will get to make important decisions about issues that affect our community over the next three years and will have a say in shaping the Taupō District for our residents and visitors for generations to come."

Candidate nomination forms will be available from next Friday on our website, from our offices in Taupō, Turangi and Mangakino or by phoning 0508 440 010. Candidate Handbooks that include information on the different roles and rules around campaigning are also available.

## CAFÉ EMBRACES TE REO

Walk into Replete Café and Delicatessen this week and you'll probably be greeted in te Reo, see Māori language signage and Māori-themed cupcakes on the counter.

The café is taking on the challenge to incorporate te Reo into their service this week with the second annual Taupō District Café Wero. The initiative is being run during Māori Language Week, which is on until Sunday.

Replete owner Chris Johnston said he decided to take part because it was a great initiative that taught people about an important element of the community.

He said when he was growing up he learned about the British empire in school, rather than New Zealand's culture and history.

"I think it's important we change that whole mindset and actually focus back on our own country," he said. "We have our own cultural language and I'd love to learn it."

He said his team was right behind it and they had enjoyed taking up the challenge.

Replete employee Toni Davis said it was important to embrace the culture and she was keen to help out. "It's a shame that we only do one week of the year - we have so many backpackers and foreign visitors coming through and it's sharing our knowledge and culture," she said. "It's beautiful to hear people speaking Māori."



## KIDS VOTING

While they won't be able to vote in this year's local elections, our young people are the voters of the future. That's why kiwi students are getting the chance to experience the election process to get them ready to vote when they reach 18-years-old.

The Kids Voting initiative is aimed at 11-15 year old students (school years 7 to 10) to experience the election process first hand. They'll get to discuss and consider key issues, vote for candidates on real issues, and will be able to compare their results against the official election results once finalised.
