SCALING NEW HEIGHTS

It's fair to say Sian Moffitt doesn't have any issues with heights - Sian works as a climbing instructor on The Edge Rockwall at Taupō Events Centre.

Sian is a competitive climber and was selected as a New Zealand senior representative this year. She has already competed in international competitions in Singapore, New Caledonia and Italy. She hopes to represent New Zealand more, particularly as climbing has now been included as an event in the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo.

Sian also competes in bouldering and is the current New Zealand Open Women's Bouldering Champion. Bouldering sees climbers ascend a 'problem' without a rope and harness, as the route is typically no higher than six metres.

Coaching young climbers from the 9-15 years agegroup also keeps her busy while she studies in Wellington.

'It is great to see young kids develop their passion for climbing and to be there to help them work through the challenges that I had to overcome. I'm glad to be able to give back to the sport I love and grew up with."



MAINTENANCE FOR BROADLANDS ROAD

Seal widening and upgrade work is being carried out south of the River Road intersection on Broadlands Road.

A 980-metre length of Broadlands Road, locally known as the River Road straight, will have the paved surface widened from the current 7.5 metres to 11 metres, improving safety for both motorists and cyclists. Work is expected to finish in late February 2018, in time for in time for the Kellogg's Nutrigrain IRONMAN New Zealand event.

With these events in December and March, busy holiday periods and limited construction opportunities due to weather conditions, we only have a small window at this time of the year to complete the improvements.

Drivers are asked to use caution, adhere to all temporary speed limits and to follow the direction of traffic controllers when travelling in this area, as there will be construction machinery on the road.
