## TERRY STRINGER SCULPTURE ON LOAN TO TAUPŌ

A stunning four-metre totem pole has been installed beside the water treatment plant platform on Lake Terrace.

Each side of the sculpture has a different story to tell, with more than one image represented.

The sculpture is on loan to the Taupō Sculpture Trust from one of New Zealand's foremost sculptors, Terry Stringer. The elegant bronze piece is named 'Flora Totem'.



## DEMOLITION OF COUNCIL BUILDING WELL UNDERWAY

Demolition of our former office building on the corner of Lake Terrace and Rifle Range Road is well underway.

Specialist contractors spent two weeks removing the asbestos and now deconstruction of the building is in full swing.

The target date for completion is Easter weekend, with the site to be grassed until a decision on a future site is made.

## WHAREWAKA SUBDIVISION STREET NAMES

The initial stages of the Wharewaka East subdivision are nearing completion, with new public roads within the area named.

The developers selected their preferred options, consulted with Tauhara hapu and local emergency services, and were presented to Council during the first meeting in February.

The street names for the area are Hara Keke Drive, Raupo Crescent, Uku Way, Roto Close and Wai Terrace. These names are all linked to natural resources and features in the Wharewaka area.

There are no duplications or similarities to other road names in the Taupō District, so these were accepted, as no objections were raised.
