Hot Water Beach has seen some improvements with work completed to strengthen the rock revetment structure.

Larger rocks have been added to the structure to help reduce erosion and protect the Lions' Walk that runs alongside the area and the nearby car park. The Lions Walk is a path frequented by both locals and visitors alike and is also used by runners for both training and events.

This erosion control and strengthening will go a long way to ensuring the area is safe for many years to come.

CLEANER, GREENER LIGHTS FOR THE TAUPO DISTRICT

The Taupō district is about to throw some light on reducing carbon emissions and improving energy efficiency with the installation of LED street lighting due to commence this week. Taupō District Council will be recycling both the existing

units and the packaging from the new ones.

Rather than leave us all in the dark in regards to funding, the New Zealand Transport Authority (NZTA) advised it would provide 85 per cent assistance to complete the upgrade to the new technology.

The first allocation is for 1200 lights, with more to come in due course.


