

COMMUNITY NEWS WITH TAUPO DISTRICT COUNCIL 16 NOVEMBER 2018

CULTURAL PRECINCT PROJECT OPTIONS DISCUSSED

This week saw Councillors deliberate on their preferred option following the public consultation and feedback received from the on-line survey.

Council met to consider 524 pieces of feedback it received on the four proposed options for the Cultural Precinct Project when it asked the community to have its say on the designs in October. Of those to indicate a preference, Option B was the most strongly favoured and is the one the council chose to be further developed.

A final masterplan will be presented to the council on December 5. In February, all options for the housing of the council's administration functions will be considered before more formal consultation with the community.

The options will be to advance the Cultural Precinct Project on Tongariro Domain, build on the former site at 72 Lake Terrace, build on the Tuwharetoa Street Carpark or remain with the status quo. Council staff currently occupy five different leased sites in the CBD.

Mayor David Trewavas said a business case was being prepared looking at all the options and any likely costs and/or benefits to better inform the council's decisionmaking going forward.



"This is the very start of the process and there is a long way to go," he said. "We need to make sure we do a thorough job at looking at all the options as this is not just about today, it is about setting our district up for the future. We are incredibly pleased so many people chose to have their say at this early stage, and we hope that continues as we move forward."

The design chosen as a preferred option for its proposed cultural precinct project is one designed to create strong links between the Central Business District and the lake's boat

WATER MAIN AND SEWER CLEANING UPDATE

When we think of a few dulcet tones, we think of the smooth vocal talents of Frank Sinatra or Michael Bublé and the like, not a way of checking sewer pipes!

Pipe checking and cleaning is continuing across the district, with many being checked using the sewer line rapid assessment tool (SL-RAT) technology. You may have heard a few tones emitting from the ground over the last week or so around your neighbourhood or across the CBD over the last week or so. Sending this audio signal is one way contractors are checking our network for blockages.

Across the month of October alone, we have accessed and surveyed 148 sewer manholes, and of these, five manholes needed additional work to locate, with three having root intrusions, fat or other blockages and have been cleared. Another three need to be raised to the surface and these will be done at a later date.

Blockages are still a key area of concern, with 'fat-bergs', third-party pipes, tree root intrusions and things dumped down manholes the main culprits.

Water network engineer Graeme Jackson says blockages can be caused by all manner of things however wet wipes are still the main culprit in obstructing our sewer mains.

The message remains the same – if it isn't pee or poo, don't flush it down the loo!
