Poolsafe is designed to recognise any aquatic facilities, including public baths, school pools, and thermal and spa pools, that have met set criteria to ensure their operations and facilities are safe. Business and operations manager Scott Attenborough said gaining the accreditation took a lot of time and effort from the diligent staff.

The animals are part of the team at the pound, with each contributing a different set of skills. They have all come from different backgrounds and become beloved members of the team.

Floyd, the cat, was a six-year-old stray found on Tonga Street in Taupō last year and brought into the Taupō SPCA. The team at the pound had been looking at ways to cut the cost of pest control and reduce the use of baits - so the idea to bring in Floyd was born.

Compliance team supervisor Ross McDonald said Floyd was chosen because he loved toy mice, demonstrating his aptitude for the job. "We were spending \$100 a month on pest control and Floyd has been amazing. We have almost no mice or rats at all now – all thanks to Floyd!" he said.

When he's not rounding up rodents, Floyd can be found chilling in the halls of the complex and greeting customers who come to adopt dogs.

Howard, the resident goat, came to the pound after being called in by a rural school. He was being a nuisance so our compliance officers picked him up and had him desexed transforming him into quite the friendly goat! He earns his keep by keeping the fence line clear of grass and providing entertainment for the kids who visit.

The pound sheep is named Phil, and he was picked up from Wairakei where he was reported as being on the loose. "Phil is our main paddock caretaker – he keeps the grass nice and short," Ross said. "He's feisty but he's a good boy and does
