TURANGI LIBRARY TO CLOSE FOR UPGRADE

THIS WEEK SEES Turangi Library closing for renovations from 1pm on Saturday, August 31.

The improvements are part of an extensive programme of work at the library, which will include the introduction of radio frequency identification (RFID) technology that allows users to issue and renew books themselves.

Work on the building itself includes a new entrance, lighting, carpet and an issuing desk. The impact on book lovers won't be too drawn out however, with the library due to reopen just over a week later on Monday September 9.

The library's wi-fi network will unfortunately not be available during the renovations and any returns can be dropped into the Turangi Service Centre during office hours.

EVERY YEAR WE send out over 90,000 pieces of mail – from rates notices to dog registrations and invoices – so there are 90,000 reasons to 'opt in' and receive all your communication via email.

Head of communications and customer relations Lisa Nairne said, while many people in the district had already chosen to opt in and switch to email, there were still quite a few relying on physical mail-outs.
