GREAT LAKE WALKWAY UPGRADE GETS UNDERWAY NEXT MONTH

CONSTRUCTION ON THE Great Lake Walkway upgrade will begin in January 2020, following detailed design, tender and consultation processes with hapū and affected landowners

The upgraded section will be from the water treatment plant on Lake Terrace, opposite Rifle Range Road, to Kowhai Road at Rainbow Point with work to be completed in stages along the walkway.

The final costs of the project are \$4,160,000 and cover widening and improving the walkway surface, addressing safety concerns, important erosion control work, and improved design that will reflect the values of local hapu.

The upgrade will provide significant long-term benefits for the community, our visitors, our lakefront environment and our economy said chief executive Gareth Green.

"The widening of the path and erosion control works will create a more user-friendly experience for visitors and locals, accommodate an increase and changing use of our lakefront and enhance the cultural importance of this outstanding natural area.

"From next year's IRONMAN world championships event alone, which relies on an upgraded path to accommodate the number of participants competing, we will see \$19.5 million brought into our district," he said.



We will be working to minimise disruption for users of the walkway, with alternative routes included where possible.

Please note, access to Rainbow Point Beach and Reserve will be restricted for four weeks in February while the first phase of work is completed there.

TAUPŌ SAFE TRADE ZONE

Taupō District Council and Taupō Police are pleased to announce the creation of a safe trade zone in Taupō. It is believed to be the first of its kind in New Zealand.

The trade zone, located in the west car park of AC Baths, is an area where parties can meet to exchange goods purchased off internet platforms such as Facebook, Trade Me and other online buy, sell, and swap sites. The zone is clearly marked with green paint and is covered by CCTV for added security.

Taupō Mayor David Trewavas said council welcomed the initiative and was fully supportive of the safe trade zone. "With more and more people using online market places to buy and sell use items, this is a great way for our community to stay safe and avoid scams. We believe this is a first for New Zealand, but I'm sure other locations will be following this lead," he said.

KEEP THE FOLLOWING SAFETY TIPS IN MIND WHEN CONDUCTING TRANSACTIONS

- » Do not go to a transaction alone.
- » Make sure a friend or family member is aware of the transaction details.
- » Insist on meeting in the Taupō safe trade zone.
- Don't go into someone else's house, and don't allow them into yours.
- » Complete the transaction during daylight hours.
- » Be extra cautious when buying or selling valuable items such as vehicles and jewellery.
- » Only use cash to complete your transactions and never deposit money into a person's account.
- » Trust your instincts, if it sounds like a scam, it probably is.
- » If somebody is not willing to come to the safe trade zone it is probably not a legitimate transaction.

FURTHER SAFETY MEASURES AT INTERSECTION

Further safety measures have been introduced at the new Arrowsmith / Kiddle / Napier Road intersection, following a post construction audit to see how the changes were working.

Last month, the intersection layout changed priority, giving traffic travelling on Kiddle Drive and Arrowsmith Avenue the right of way, with vehicles on Napier Road required to stop.

The previous layout was named one of New Zealand Transport Agency's top 10 crash sites in 2009 with the new design created in consultation with traffic specialists to ensure safety was the number one priority.

Head of operations Kevin Strongman said the council had listened to community feedback since the new layout was introduced.

Additional 'stop ahead' markings on both approaches will be installed by January along with threshold markings (red surfacing with 50 speed-limit painted on the road).

EVERY DROP COUNTS

As the district fills up with visitors and temperatures rise, demand for water increases dramatically.

Last year, we saw an increase in demand of 50 per cent across the district in January and we are expecting a similar increase this year, so we are asking residents to act now to reduce demand.

Please only water your garden and lawn every second day (using the odds and evens system based on your street address). This applies to fixed sprinklers only. Hand held hoses can be used at any time.

NEW YEAR'S DAY LITTER PICK-UP

We all love living and visiting our district so why not take the opportunity on New Year's Day to get together with friends and continue to look after the place we love?

Dogs may be exercised off-leash in the following public places provided they are kept under control:

Control Gates Reserve, Spa Thermal Park (excluding children's play equipment), Kimberley Reserve, Tamatea Water Reserve, Titoki Water Reserve, Hawai Street Reserve, Secombe Park, Besley Park.

From December 1 to March 31 between 9am and 7pm, dogs are prohibited from:

The Lakefront Reserve, Two Mile Bay Reserve and beach area, part of the beach area from Mapou Road to Kowhai Road, Wharewaka Reserve and beach area from below Kohatu Parade to Wharewaka Point and the beach. This excludes walkways where dogs are allowed on lead.
