COVID-19 - OUR DISTRICT

LAST WEEK, THE Government declared a state of national emergency to ensure we could respond appropriately to COVID-19.

Civil Defence has mobilised and the district's Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) has been activated to support the response to COVID-19 at a district level. A joint effort between South Waikato District Council and

Taupō District Council, the team is working to identify the vulnerable in our communities and to coordinate the various volunteer groups that are helping out at this time.

- · Awareness of the five key points for:
 - Safe practices
 - Age appropriate
 - Vulnerable groups who are they targeting
 - Volunteer integrity
 - · Whanau first
- · Distribution venue
- Awareness of Health and Safety measures including in regard to COVID-19
