A FAMILIAR FACE at the Turangi Turtle Pools became a familiar face at the local supermarket during Alert Level 4 – and then to television viewers around New Zealand.

Tupara Tupara, a lifeguard at the Turtle Pools, stepped up as soon as we went into lockdown and was on the front line as an essential worker at Turangi New World, helping customers to social distance and making sure trolleys were sanitised after each use.

Despite having two young children and a newborn baby at home, Tupara said he didn't hesitate as soon as he saw there was a need.

"I just wanted to help out the community. I'm a local boy, and it helped that a lot of people know me from the pools. People were a bit anxious and having a familiar face there makes a difference – a lot of locals want to give a hug when they see each other and we had to remind them that the hugs had to wait until After Level 4!

"We were looking after everyone - whether it was handing out umbrellas or looking after the queue - but our older people and expectant mothers were our priority. And it was great to see how the Turangi community responded, I think they were awesome," he said.

A lot of other people thought he was awesome too.



He appeared on The Project current events show and was awarded a Best Foods Supermarket Heroes award after 133 nominations poured in.

"Getting the award was cool, and I'd like to thank Best Foods for that, as well as council for letting me take up the role and New World for giving me the opportunity – they were great to work for. But mostly I want to thank my partner for looking after the family and the community for playing it safe," he said. And now that we're back at Level 1, you can find Tupara back

in his role at the Turtle Pools, helping people play it safe there.


