DID YOU KNOW we have bylaws that outline what you need to consider when keeping animals, birds and bees? These bylaws are due for review but before we draft them, we want your feedback on what you think we need to include!

Dog ownership, including where you are allowed

The bylaws cover things like:

- to walk your dog.
- · Keeping of bees in residential areas · Keeping livestock in residential areas
- Penalties for breaking the bylaw

We are currently conducting a pre-consultation to help us frame up what new/revised animals, birds and bees bylaw will look like, as well as the control of dogs bylaw. From there, we will collate your feedback and use it to draft the bylaws, we will then do a formal consultation with the community. This is expected to happen in December and January.

TUWHARETOA/RUAPEHU INTERSECTION UPDATE

JUST A REMINDER that our contractors have now moved across the road, to finish the other side of the intersection upgrade at Tuwharetoa / Ruapehu streets.

This means there will be a road closure at the end of Tuwharetoa St – adjacent to Indian Affair and Farmers – for approximately the next six weeks. There will be a turning bay for traffic.

It also means that the team have completed the first half of the intersection upgrade and opened the opposite side of the intersection to traffic (adjacent to Number One Shoes and Farmers).

The intersection upgrade is part of the wider Taupō Town Centre Transformation project which received \$20.6 million in government funding in June. This part of the project involves the realignment of each corner to improve health and safety and sight lines, repaving, curved seating and new planting. A raised pedestrian crossing is also being installed.

Thanks for your patience as we work to transform our CBD.

GRAFFIATO COMES TO THE MUSEUM

A SPECIAL ONE-OFF exhibition celebrating Graffiato street art festival's 10-year anniversary this year is now on at the museum.

is free to Taupō District residents with proof of address.



DO YOU KNOW what to do in an earthquake? Practice your skills with the annual earthquake drill – Shake Out – that's on next Thursday.

Shake Out is all about reminding people of the right actions to take in the event of an earthquake – to drop, cover and hold. It happens around the world and is particularly important for New Zealanders because we live in a pretty shaky country.

Emergency manager Ian Connon said the Taupō District was prone to earthquakes and it was critical for our residents to know what to do in an emergency.

"Learning these skills can save lives – if we know how to respond in an earthquake we are protecting ourselves and the ones we love," he said.
