HAVE YOUR SAY ON PEDESTRIAN MALLS PROPOSED FOR TAUPO TOWN CENTRE

WE'RE NOW CALLING for feedback from the community on the creation of two pedestrian malls (spaces that largely operate as a pedestrian zone, with reduced access for vehicles) in the town centre.

This is part of the Taupō Town Centre transformation project which aims to turn our CBD into an area with quality places, that puts people first



HOROMĀTANGI STREET

We are proposing to create a pedestrian mall on the eastern side of the Horomātangi Street and Tītīraupenga Street intersection. This includes the creation of a cul-de-sac. The main objective for creating the pedestrian mall is to ensure the safety of pedestrians, in particular, Taupō Primary School students who frequently cross here.



LAKE TERRACE

The second pedestrian mall proposed is an area of Lake Terrace near Roberts street. One of the aims of this project is to better connect our public spaces to the surrounding environment and utilise what we are so blessed to have here - a beautiful lake and a real opportunity to create inviting, attractive spaces. This pedestrian mall will allow for a much larger public space and enhance pedestrian and cycling connections along the lakefront.

HAVE YOUR SAY ON MĀORI WARDS

THE COMMUNITY WILL have a chance to have its say on the introduction of Māori wards, following a decision last week by Council.

The decision follows changes to the Local Electoral Act in March, which have implications for council's decision to establish Māori wards for the 2022 and 2025 local government elections, which was voted on in November 2020. Previously, members of the community had the right to demand a poll to reverse the decision, but the changes to legislation mean a poll received by the council last month is no longer valid.

Changes to the Local Electoral Act mean council now has more time to seek feedback from the community about their views on the establishment of Māori wards and they chose to proceed with this after discussions at Tuesday's meeting.

Taupō District Mayor David Trewavas said the changes to the legislation aimed to align the treatment of Māori wards with the treatment of general wards as much as possible.

The decision to seek feedback means we have a chance to further engage with our community on its views and take them into consideration as we look forward to the 2022 elections."

Mr Trewavas said this meant the community would be able to give feedback online or by post from tomorrow, Friday, March 19, which would be considered by councillors at the April council meeting.

Physical feedback forms will be available from all council offices and online for the duration of the feedback period.



AC BATHS SET TO CLOSE FOR MAINTENANCE THIS WEEKEND

The AC Baths' leisure pool and hydroslides will close for 10 days from 2pm this Sunday, March 21 for maintenance.

The pool is scheduled to reopen on Tuesday, March 30.

About a million litres of water will have to be pumped out of the leisure pool to allow the first major maintenance and closure at the AC Baths since its refurbishment in 2013.

The work will see all the tiles around the bombing island and on the entry stairs replaced, new lining in the "water overflow" areas of the pool, the repair of pipes and valves and the cleaning and inspection of areas inaccessible when the pool is full.

Two lanes of the outdoor 25m pool will be open for public and leisure use from 10.30am to 3.30pm and from 6pm to closing time each day during the closure to allow a space for leisure pool activity while avoiding peak outdoor 25m lane pool times.

The learn-to-swim pool, indoor and outdoor 25m pools and saunas will remain open. All aqua shallow classes normally held in the leisure pool from Monday March 22 to Monday March 29 are cancelled and will resume Wednesday, March 31 as per the timetable. There is no change to the aqua deep classes, which would be held as normal in the indoor 25m pool.

The maintenance has been planned and budgeted for in the Longterm Plan 2018-2028.
