Hi Louise,

Ive spent some time looking through this today.

My feedback, and some of the areas I think the planting plan can be improved on include:

- Tree Sizes: The specified grades for the trees are relatively small, ranging between PB3 and PB5, which equates to approximately 1 to 3-litre pots. However, the height of the trees at the time of planting hasn't been clearly defined. While this may be suitable for certain native plantings along the edges, trees at these grades are likely to be only around 500mm tall at planting time, based on typical heights for these pot sizes. To ensure adequate initial height and a better chance of successful mitigation, I suggest increasing the size of some species. For example, the Prunus Lusitanica should ideally be a minimum of 150cm tall (equivalent to a 45L/PB95) at the time of planting.
- Planting Density: In certain areas, the planting scheme consists of only a single row of trees or plants. However, this approach leaves the landscape vulnerable to potential gaps in case of plant failure, mortality, or slow establishment. To enhance resilience and create a more robust edge treatment, I recommend incorporating additional planting in these areas to establish a 'double-layered' edge. Please refer to the sketch below for clarification.

Other than these comments. Overall, it's a big improvement from the previous planting plan provided in that:

- The proposed planting to the retaining will visually soften and integrate this structure.
- There are a number of trees that have been incorporated throughout the design these will (once established) reach some good height to enable to enable a break up the scale and mass of the building.
- The planting circles the building and provides some good integration with the wider landscape patterns.

I would recommend a standard condition of consent that this planting be provided as part of the development, including maintenance period and that it be retained.
