A BIG THANK YOU to everyone for your patience as we have worked through the repairs from the washout that shut Lake Terrace for three months.

Major infrastructure repairs have involved complex design challenges, with the installation of more than 300 metres of watermain pipes

as well as new stormwater and sewer systems. A new nine-metre high retaining wall has also been built.

The sewer and watermain were positioned further away from the lake, and we installed a new stormwater separator that will help to stop pollutants entering the lake.



GREAT LAKE WALKWAY UPGRADE

The Great Lake Walkway will be upgraded next year to accommodate increased and changing use of our lakefront.

The upgraded section will be from the water treatment plant on Lake Terrace. opposite Rifle Range Road, to Kowhai Road at Rainbow Point. It involves replacing the pavers, widening the path and completing erosion control work in some areas.

The upgrade of the Great Lake Walkway was included in Council's 2018-2028 Long-Term Plan and will create a safer experience for visitors and locals, and enhance the cultural importance of this outstanding natural area. It will also allow us to accommodate the IRONMAN 70.3 World Championships in November 2020.

Work is expected to begin in January 2020 with completion due in July 2020, weather permitting. We are working to minimise disruptions to pathway users throughout the upgrade.

The IRONMAN events in December and March will not be affected by the project.















RECYCLING DURING THE HOLIDAY PERIOD

Please also place the heavier recyclable items on top of your recycling bins to prevent any contents being blown away in the wind. We encourage everyone to have their recycling out before 7.30am for pick-up.

LANDFILL AND DISTRICT TRANSFER STATIONS will be closed on Christmas Day and will return to business as usual from Boxing Day.

IRON AN. 70.3 WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

IM703WC 2020 IS COMING!

SINCE 1985, THE IRONMAN event has been synonymous with our district. You might say it's a bit of a cult here, with athletes consistently choosing Taupō as their favourite place to compete. Now, athletes from all over the world will descend on Taupō as we get set to host the 2020 IRONMAN 70.3 World Championships on November 28 and 29.

This international event will be the biggest our district has ever seen. It's estimated the two-day event will bring an economic return of \$20 million to the Taupō District – equal to two-thirds of the \$30 million per year that events currently generate in the district.

Using our annual Nutri-Grain IRONMAN New Zealand races and celebrations as a baseline, here is some context:

BY THE NUMBERS

IRONMAN New Zealand has about 1600 athletes in a good year – the World's will have over 6000.	IRONMAN New Zealand has about 40 countries represented – the World's has about 110.	IRONMAN New Zealand happens over one day – the World's has women racing on Saturday, men on Sunday.
IRONMAN New Zealand will bring about 5000 people to town (athletes, supporters, staff and spectators) – the World's will be closer to 25,000.	IRONMAN New Zealand has two sit-down dinners for about 1100 people – the World's has two sit-down dinners for about 6500 people.	IRONMAN New Zealand has one or two national media organisations represented – the World's will have about 500 media outlets present.

IRONMAN New Zealand mainly operates out of the Great Lake Centre and the Northern Domain – the World's will need to utilise a lot more greenspace in Taupō for transition, fan zones, bike construction, food/markets, parking and associated activities.

TURANGI UPDATE

A new aquatic climbing wall is the latest addition to the Turtle Pools complex.

The wall sits on the edge of the deep pool and is accessible from the water.

The equipment was chosen due to its suitability for all ages and local kids have given it the seal of approval!
